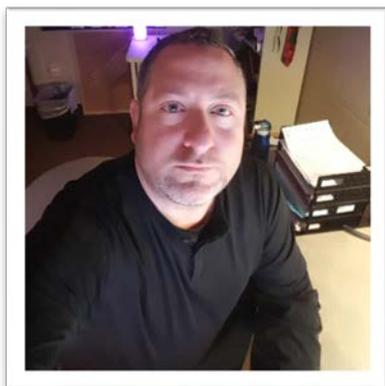
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### President's Message

If you have not already done so, please submit a presentation proposal. **Submissions are due February 28, 2018.** Presentations are encouraged to cover any portion of the broad scope of the IR profession.

We invite participants to present research and discuss ideas on institutional research in general, methods for improving the quality and utility of data, and best practices in sharing all different data types with institutional decision-makers. Additionally, we encourage presentations that are collaborative in nature, particularly within or among institutions, and that focus on sharing different approaches to a similar problem or project.

Your participation in the conference can be expressed through several venues:

- Paper (45 min)
- Demonstration (45 min)
- Panel discussion (45 min)
- Breakfast SIG or Table Topic (varies)
- Poster session (60 min)
- \*\*\*Pre-conference workshop/interactive presentations for new IR professionals attending their first or second IR conference; sessions that advance the technological know-how of members; or something new and exciting (No boundaries- be creative!) (90-180 min)

### **2017-2018 INAIR Mentoring Program**

The INAIR Mentoring Program has been going well. For the 2017-2018 INAIR mentoring season, the mentoring program is 10 weeks with monthly mentor program development webinars that are optional. The mentoring program officially started the week of December 4, 2017 and ends when mentors and mentees have the opportunity to meet at the 2018 INAIR conference this upcoming March. Each week, mentees and their assigned mentors have a topic to help guide their discussion via email. An example topic a part of this year mentor program curriculum is *Sharing One's Career Aspirations*. Assigned mentors have the opportunity to share what their career aspirations were working in Institutional Research (IR). Mentees also have the opportunity to share some of their career aspirations as paraprofessionals or as new IR professionals.

### **Mentoring Development Webinar Topics Needed**

For the 2017-2018 Mentoring Program, Membership Chair Brooke Moreland, would like to introduce monthly Mentoring Development Webinars. ### **INAIR Growing Scholars Internship**

Like last year, the INAIR Growing Scholars Internship will continue. This internship has a goal to develop and assign tasks that align with the INAIR purpose. INAIR purposes to 1) promote institutional research in education as a professional activity, 2) disseminate information about the methods and contents of institutional research, 3) provide a forum in which institutional researchers in Indiana can discuss and seek assistance in their common problems and share research findings, and 4) promote the

professional development of INAIR members. The intern will develop and strengthen the following skills: administration, organizational recruitment, knowledge management, and organizational communication.

The student will work one-on-one with me regarding the membership efforts of our organization. S/he will help to build the membership base, and to find individuals across our great state that may be a great fit as members for the Indiana Association for Institutional Research. S/he will also learn to build research and at the end of their internship experiences, will publish an article in a regional student affairs magazine.

The internship opportunity will officially begin Tuesday, January 17<sup>th</sup> after the MLKJR holiday and conclude with the intern attending the 2018 INAIR Annual Conference in March.
